## Further details on the start-up crowdfunding exemption

The following is a high-level summary of the start-up crowdfunding exemption proposed by the Autorité des marchés financiers, the Financial and Consumer Affairs Authority of Saskatchewan, Financial and Consumer Service Commission of New Brunswick, the Manitoba Securities Commission and the Nova Scotia Securities Commission. Qualification criteria	<ul> <li>Head office must be located in a participating jurisdiction</li> <li>Available to non-reporting issuers only</li> <li>Not available to investment funds</li> </ul>
